

Paradox #1: Truly Satisfied?

- “Blessed are they which do hunger.” (Matthew 5:6)
- “Jesus said unto them, I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger;...(John 6:35)

Paradox #2: To yoke or not to yoke?

- “Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. (**Matthew 11:29**)
- “Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage.” (**Galatians 5:1**)

Paradox #3: The role of works?

- “A man is justified by faith without the deeds of the law. (**Romans 3:28**)
- “Ye see then how that by works a man is justified, and not by faith only.” (**James 2:24**)

Paradox #4: Going public with good works?

- “Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.” (**Matthew 5:16**)
- “Take heed that ye do not your alms before men, to be seen of them: otherwise ye have no reward of your Father which is in heaven. (**Matthew 6:1**)

Paradox #5: Who’s the judge?

- And if ye call on the Father, who without respect of persons judgeth according to every man's work (**1 Peter 1:17**)
- “ For the Father judgeth no man, but hath committed all judgment unto the Son” (**John 5:22**)

Paradox #6: Is Christ a peacemaker?

- “For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.” (**Isaiah 9:6**)
- “Think not that I am come to send peace on earth: I came not to send peace, but a sword.” (**Matthew 10:34**)

Paradox #7: Wise dealings with fools

- “Answer not a fool according to his folly, lest thou also be like unto him. **Proverbs 26:4**
- “Answer a fool according to his folly, lest he be wise in his own conceit. **Proverbs 26:5**

Paradox #8: The reason for Christ’s coming

- “for I came not to judge the world, but to save the world. (**John 12:47**)
- “And Jesus said, For judgment I am come into this world, that they which see not might see; and that they which see might be made blind.” (**John 9:39**)
